- 9. Julie Sico has kindly volunteered to co-ordinate speakers for future meetings
- 10. Riders have been experiencing problems with horses on the bridleway near the Red Well, Arkholme. The County Council Enforcement Officer advises that there is no legislation to force owners of land to accept erection of fencing if they refuse to give permission.
- 11. Any Other Business
- i) A local man is considering setting up a Paddock Management business and would appreciate members' thoughts and feedback. It was recommended that he print some cards for distribution.
- ii) Houghton Equestrian at Kirkby Lonsdale is holding a talk on laminitis on 26<sup>th</sup> March, free entry.
- iii) Rose Thornton brought along some supplementary rides for placing in the 'Local Rides' pack.
- iv) A holiday complex development is proposed at Borrowdale, which will upgrade the bridleway to a road and change the character of the valley. Details are on the Eden District Council website www.eden.gov.uk. NLBS has already submitted an objection.
- v) A member told the meeting about 3 appalling gates on a Winmarleigh bridleway, and asked how to get something done about it. Lancashire County Council's website has a system for complaining about rights of way, and fast replies are assured.

There was then a talk from Zoe of World Horse Welfare about our nearest rescue centre, Penny Farm at Blackpool. Firstly she explained that the organisation had changed its name from ILPH as the new name was more meaningful. They were set up due to the horrific transportation conditions for horses exported from the UK for the meat market, and this is still an issue today in other countries.

Penny farm can accommodate 65 horses, and there are also 3 other centres in the UK. The Field Officers offer guidance and help first of all, then as a last resort prosecution or surrender of the animal. Horses coming into the centre have 3 weeks in isolation, then rehabilitation starts as soon as the horse is fit enough.

Rehoming details are available on their website, all homes are checked at frequent intervals. There is also an Adoption Scheme.

4 years ago new legislation was introduced in the EU to improve transportation conditions, but has not been effective and a petition has been set up. WHW also have an Overseas Training Team in countries such as Mexico, where they educate horseowners and train 'trainers' to carry on the good work.

We can all support them by attending their Open day on 12<sup>th</sup> September and participating in their toner cartridge and mobile phone recycling scheme
